Sept. 2024

The CELAP 2.0 program launch, introducing participants to the program and starting wellness sessions focused on resilience and selfcare.

Oct. - Dec. 2024

The official kickoff celebrates the cohort and begins organizational assessments to create tailored capacity-building plans.

Jan. - July 2025

Participants engage in ongoing wellness sessions and capacity-building workshops to enhance leadership skills and organizational effectiveness.

Aug. - Sept. 2025

The program concludes with final evaluations, participant reflections, and a celebratory close-out ceremony honoring their achievements.
